Old Station 9 To Be Transformed

The Belmont Firehouse will soon be undergoing some upgrades to combine historic accuracy and modern day requirements. Beginning in July, work should begin to rebuild the main floor bathroom to be become compliant with the American with Disabilities Act. Also, the exit doors on the north side of the building will be rebuilt to provide a legal exit size and motion. Most

dramatic will be the apparatus door opening. This will be revamped to become the public entrance. The design will include a change that will add the original twin arched apparatus doors to the face of the building. Not only will it look like the original design, but added windows will help showcase the contents of the building, inviting visitors to enter the facility.
